


Lenten Dinner Series

Faith in Action Activates Economic Empowerment in Bolivia



St. Andrew's mission partner Five Talents is an international microfinance non-profit whose mission is to transform lives through economic empowerment. Concurrently, they are fostering spiritual transformations in the communities they serve. This includes their Bolivia program, which St. Andrew's has supported since 2014.

Five Talents partners with local churches in these remote communities to teach basic literacy, numeracy, and business skills, so that men and women living in extreme poverty are able to find **sustainable pathways** out of it. This training happens within **community Literacy and Savings Groups**. Neighbors learn how to read, write, count, save money little by little and eventually how to start and run a small business.

And because Five Talents partners with the church, the principle of Faith in Action is inherently woven throughout these programs, becoming an activator for economic empowerment. As women and men who join Five Talents Literacy and Savings Groups experience Christ's love through Five Talents' implementing partners:

- They learn who they are in Christ and how God sees them
- They start to recognize and acknowledge their own inherent worth and value
- They see how their own community values them and their God-given talents

This three-pronged transformation becomes the catalyst for sustainable economic empowerment. Mary's story of impact, accessible here and attached in a shortened form illustrates this spiritual development.

Scholarships Available

Renewable scholarships of \$4,000 to \$15,000 are available from the Lola G. Duff and William H. Duff II Scholarship

Fund for students of Protestant Faith in Allegheny County, PA.

Students can apply for financial need and/or merit based awards.



Applicants must:

- Be students who resided in, have attended two academic years, and graduated from, a high school or home school in Allegheny County, PA.
- Provide verification of Protestant faith.
- Be high school seniors or graduates who plan to enroll, or students already enrolled, in a full-time undergraduate course of study leading to an initial bachelor's degree at an accredited four-year educational institution.

Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.8 on a 4.0 scale.

The exhibition is a moving tribute, memorializing the victims and leading viewers to a place of empathy through the power of art.

Faith in Action Activates Economic Empowerment in Bolivia

Mary, a mother of three daughters, runs a baking business in Bolivia to support them. She bakes cakes, cookies, and other sweets in large quantities for a variety of clients.

She first heard about Five Talents' program from a church pastor in her community. When she initially joined her Savings Group, group leaders characterized Mary as "shy and insecure about her opinions." They say she typically sat quietly in a corner of the meeting room for fear of mispronouncing a word or because she didn't think what she had to say was important.



Over time, though, Mary says the support and acceptance she felt from the group leaders and fellow members helped her to recognize how God sees her and it helped her to see her own self differently. One of the group leaders shared: "Mary was given the opportunity to teach the group and with great courage, Mary managed to express herself in simple words, and I congratulated her a lot..."

Mary was trying to grow her business in order to make enough profit to build a house for herself and her children. Using a loan from her group, she was able to buy a laminator to better package and present her baked goods. This saved her a lot of time, so she could make more goods to sell. She says in addition to her growing business and a growing confidence in her own abilities, her faith in God grew too.

"My business is an example of perseverance. My neighbors have seen my needs and difficulties. I believe that now I am someone who shows them how powerful God is. I maintain a business in which the daily bread is kindness, honesty, and love for others. And the most beautiful thing... my trust and dependence on the Lord... I feel like I am growing in my life step by step. So that one day I managed to express myself with security and most importantly answer questions confidently, not just counting my life experiences, but also with Bible verses. I am preparing for this goal."
